## Identified Improvement Targets in Progress

- Rose Colby, author of *Competency Based Education a New Architecture for K-12 Schooling*, met with teachers, and staff to clarify any questions or concepts as we transition to CBE. This was a great opportunity to delve deeper into the questions and concepts staff had and to have Rose review the CBE work which is ongoing at the high school.

## Student & Staff Accomplishments

- Twenty staff completed the Well 100 challenge through NHIT in December, a 5 week challenge with weekly tasks for hydration, stress management, sleep, fitness and member's choice. We had a friendly competition between the Math and Science department with the Science department coming out on top with a total of 1454 points!
- The French Honor Society used bake sales to raise funds and donate \$400 this month to Togo Humanitaire, a nonprofit that helps build schools and supply fresh water in Togo.
- Trevor Mills will be playing in the ChAD All Star game in June and Brett Miller has been selected to play in the Shrine game vs Vermont. This is a terrific honor for both students and it is great to see Kennett represented at both of these events.
- Life of an Athlete students successfully organized a "White Out Hunger" fundraiser at the two doubleheader varsity basketball games vs Berlin and Kingswood. The students collected 668 items of food and \$1,885 was raised for End 68 Hours of Hunger in Conway and the Vaughan Community Center.
- Thirty seven Kennett seniors were recognized by the NHIAA, as scholar athletes in a ceremony in Concord on February 5th for their academic, community service and athletic accomplishments. Each senior recognized has maintained a B+ average or above during their high school career, played at least two sports a year and contributed with community service during that time. This is the largest number of Kennett seniors who have earned this prestigious NHIAA Scholar Athlete award.
- Kennett indoor track athletes placed at the Division II state meet): Chris Caputo - 4th place (long jump) Chloe Van Dyne - 5th place (high jump)
- Kennett Hockey will be hosting its 4th Annual Teddy Bear Toss on Saturday, February 17th, at 6:00 pm at the Ham Arena. The Eagles will face off against the Somersworth/Coe-Brown Bearcats, and the goal of the night will be to secure a victory, while also collecting as many

stuffed animals as we can. Since we began holding the event in 2014, we have collected approximately 300 stuffed animals for children in need. This year, the stuffed animals thrown on the ice at the game will be donated to the Children's Hospital at Dartmouth-Hitchcock, otherwise known as CHaD. To ensure that we collect the most stuffed animals we can, a special edition Kennett Hockey Teddy Bear will be sold at the game for \$15 each or two for \$20, with the idea being that fans will have the opportunity to buy one bear to throw onto the ice, and one bear to bring home and commemorate this great event.
