## Identified Improvement Targets in Progress

- NEASC standards group 1, Core Values, Beliefs, and Learning Expectations, is set to present its finding and have a faculty vote at the faculty meeting Tuesday, January 15th. This is the second monthly NEASC group report out and the work of all seven NEASC groups remain on schedule.
- Kennett High School will be hosting the North Country Youth Leadership Conference on Monday, January 28th. The focus of the conference will be two fold, first to empower student leaders to address the E-Cigarette and vaping issues within our schools and secondly to create a youth advocacy group within each school to be used as a resource to address any number of behavioral issues. The nationally recognized Dover Youth to Youth Advocacy Group will teach our students the skills necessary to take on these challenging issues. This will be a small personal hands on conference with no more than 50 students. Students will be attending from Kingswood Senior and Junior High, Fryeburg Academy, Bartlett Middle School, Kennett Middle School, Moultonborough Academy Senior and Junior High, Brett Middle School, and the Paul Middle School. There will be 2 students from each grade 7-11 and at least one adult who will work the students once they go back to their school. There is no fee for the conference which is funded by the Carroll County Commission for Public Health, lunch will be served and all necessary resources will be provided.

## Student & Staff Accomplishments

- The boys and girls basketball teams raised \$1200 for Angels and Elves at their annual shoot-a-thon fundraiser. In addition our Life of an Athlete students partnered with other Kennett student organizations and together they donated over \$300 to Angels and Elves.
- The girls' basketball team is currently undefeated and tied for first place in Division II. During the recent holiday break the team placed first at the Mike Lee Holiday Tournament at Farmington High School. Congratulations to Isabel Wroblewski and Maddie Stewart who made the all-tournament team.

- The Kennett High School Counseling Department took advantage of alumni that were home for the holidays inviting former graduates to sit on a panel to provide current students information and insight on the transition from high school to the next stage of their journey. Topics they spoke to were everything from how they decided how to get involved, deal with time management, dorm/barrack life, academic preparedness, and answering any specific questions our current students had.
