

Their project was a replication of a Harvard University experiment looking to unlock the mystery of the growth of super bugs which become resistant to traditional medicine. The doctors were thoroughly impressed with the students' research and engaged them in a robust scientific conversation on the challenge super bugs present and discussed ways the Memorial Hospital staff was trying to manage this problem.
