- The girls and boys alpine ski teams won the 2018 Division II state championship. Our ski jump team won the 2018 New Hampshire championship. Both the boys and girls nordic ski teams successfully defended their Division II state championships, and Jordanna Belle-Isle was the runner-up in the Division II skimeister competition.
- The Kennett hockey team is playing in the Division III semifinals for the second year in a row. The Kennett hockey team has earned a place in the NHIAA ice hockey playoffs 11 of the last 12 years, truly an amazing accomplishment.

- The girls basketball team made it to the Division II quarterfinals, hosting two home playoff games, and finished the season 15-5 and the boys basketball team made it to the Division II preliminary round, finishing the season 10-9.
- Seven Kennett Life of an Athlete students will attend the NHIAA / NHADA Student Leadership Conference at the Mount Washington Hotel on March 15th - 16th. This represents a great chance to acquire leadership skills and collaborate with athletes from around the state.
- Spring sports meetings will be held on Monday, March 12th. The Family ID online registration program will once again be utilized. Spring sports begin on Monday, March 19th.
- The winter sports awards will be held on Wednesday, March 14th to recognize the accomplishments of all of our winter athletes and coaches.
- Amy Cotter is presenting her scientific research – “The Effect of Black Carbon in Antibiotic Resistance” - at the NH State Science and Engineering Expo in Concord on March 15th. She is presenting on the work she has accomplished in her ELO independent study with Lindsay Cole. She is the first Kennett student to present at this Expo!
